Dear Friends,

Almost 25 years ago, a group of parents, business owners, community leaders and elected officials identified the need for a multidisciplinary hub in Macomb County, where professionals involved in the investigation, prosecution, and treatment of cases of child sexual abuse could work collaboratively with one common goal – providing protection and justice to child victims of abuse. They envisioned a child-friendly place where child victims and their families would feel safe and supported and believed. That place was Care House.

Since our opening in 1996, Care House has coordinated over 8,500 forensic interviews for suspected child victims of sexual abuse, physical abuse or witness to a violent act. As the only agency in Macomb County providing a comprehensive response to these sensitive cases, Care House has also provided support services to more than 11,500 families, all at no cost to the families we serve.

On the eve of our 25th anniversary year, we often marvel on how far we have come. Our growth demonstrates the capability and commitment of our team, the leadership of our Board of Directors and the generous support of the community which has been instrumental for us to answer an increasing demand for our services. This growth includes increasing from 57 forensic interviews in 1996 to 757 in 2019, and from operating with only a small staff in our Mount Clemens office to expanding our services to a satellite center in Warren with a professional staff of 13. We also take great pride in the development of our robust internship component, which offers specialized hands-on training for dozens of social work, criminal justice and counseling students each year to competently and sensitively support and advocate for child victims.

2020 has been a very challenging year for Care House and the families we serve. Our services were determined to be "essential" by the state of Michigan and doors remained open for children and families, even during state Stay-at-Home orders. Unfortunately, two of our annual fundraising events were canceled this year, but the need for our services continues to grow. We have seen a greater need for support from families impacted by the pandemic, and we anticipate a surge in requests for forensic interviews for months after the pandemic has subsided.

We invite our community to move forward with us to continue and expand critical intervention, treatment, and prevention services. The actions we take today will have an impact on the lives of generations to come. With your support, vulnerable children in our community will have the opportunity for a brighter future. Thank you for your interest in the work we do to provide help, hope and healing to child victims of abuse. We are forever humbled and grateful for your ongoing support.


